Interview Summary	Bernadette and Mary talk about their involvement in ladies sports in Leitrim, although neither of them is from the area originally. Bernadette talks mostly about her involvement since 2000 when a ladies adult team was re-established. She explains how she got involved in the Féile competition and how this led to her moving on to the administrative positions at County Board level. Mary begins by telling of her time playing camogie in the 1970s. She goes on to describe her role in administration and her involvement with school teams. Both ladies talk about the relationship between ladies teams and the GAA, both at a local and national level. They talks about their families' involvement in Gaelic games and the importance of the Association in their lives.

21:20 Mary talks about Scór in the area and in the county. Tells of club successes. Mentions Pat Fox, Cormac McGiolla, Joe Flynn.
24:25 Bernadette tells of how she became secretary of the County Board. Mentions the Féile. Refers to volunteerism.
25:45 Mary talks about her family's involvement. Mentions her sons Joseph, Cormac, her daughter Clodagh and her husband Joseph.
26:52 Bernadette talks about her family's involvement and what it has meant to them.
28:05 Mary remembers washing the jerseys.
29:00 Bernadette tells of coaching a Leitrim Under 16 team.
