They also discuss the economic circumstances in which they reared their family, detailing how they brought their children to matches. They reveal the effect of their commitment to the GAA on their family life. Seán recalls his administrative roles in the GAA and discusses the inception of the Offaly Supporters Club. Seán discusses the future of the GAA and recalls his highlights from the GAA.

55:30 They discuss their highlights in Offaly GAA. Seán mentions 1998 All-Ireland hurling semi-final refixture against Clare in Thurles. Recalls sitting on pitch in Croke Park in

protest after premature ending to replay. Mentions Paudie Mulhaire. Also mentions Kerry v Kildare hurling match being cancelled due to protest on pitch. Mentions Mick Brehan stopping member of Offaly County Board from hacking up the pitch. Also mentions GAA PRO Danny Lynch.
