Eugene talks about becoming treasurer of the club, a position he has held for nearly 40 years. He describes what the role involves and how the club has changed during his involvement. He discusses the current state of the club and the high costs involved in running a GAA club. He talks about running a county ground and how this impacts on the club. Towards the end of the interview, Eugene discusses the role the GAA has played in his life and recalls the various trips the club has taken over the years.

07:20 Describes what playing for the county was like then and talks about the people involved during that period – Pauric McShea, Brian McEniff, Martin Carney. Recalls his first intercounty match, a league match against Louth.

08:54 Discusses his different administrative roles with the club. Becoming treasurer. Highlights the price of insurance today.

09:55 Talks about his role as treasurer and fundraising. Describes how the role has changed over the years and the benefit of having a county ground in MacCumhaill Park. Dealing with the expense of the club and developing the ground.

14:48 Describes the relationship between the club and the county board.

16:20 Talks about what his role during match day involves.

17:55 Discusses the building of the club's social centre. Talks about running a lotto for the club and the different fundraising they do.

19:33 Talks about the building of the bar in the club.

20:23 Discusses the issue of keeping the club's facilities modern. Talks about insurance prices and the different costs the club pay.

22:45 Talks about why he became involved in administration. His family's interest in the GAA.

24:00 Describes the size of the club and the amount of teams. Talks about ladies football in the club and efforts to start camogie in the club. Having hurling and football in the club and winning a senior hurling title in 2010.

	25:50 Talks about his best memories from the GAA. Winning a senior championship with the club.
	26:30 Recalls travelling to America with the club and playing matches in Philadelphia and New York. Talks about the trip and to the different places they have travelled to.
