Joe and Mossie discuss the history of Gaelic football in the Castlegregory area, and explain the intricacies of how the game is organised in the area. They recall their first trips to Croke Park, and debate the role of volunteers within the Association. They conclude by explaining what their involvement in the GAA has meant to them.

08:08 Joe recalls his earliest memories of the GAA. Mentions parish finals. Mentions former club president Michael O'Donnell. Mentions successes, and recalls playing for Tuam Stars, winning a Galway minor county championship medal with them.

09:33 Joe mentions highlights of his involvement in the GAA – the development of a new field for Castlegregory in the 1990s.

09:51 Joe mentions his administrative roles with the club.

10:25 Joe discusses his playing days in Tuam. Mentions Sean Purcell and Frank Stockwell. Recalls playing illegally for two clubs in the one summer.

11:55 Joe describes the Castlegregory pitch when he was growing up. Recalls how the new pitch was acquired. Mentions Paddy Healy and Michael O'Donnell. Recalls establishment of committee in America by Timmy Brosnan to raise funds for the new pitch development. Mentions official opening in 2003 with an exhibition match between Kerry and Mayo, opened by County Board Chairman Sean Walsh.

14:18 Joe recalls his family's involvement in the GAA. Describes the organisation of teams and training in earlier times.

15:03 Joe mentions former Castlegregory and Kerry player, Pat "Aeroplane" O'Shea. Mentions his role in the purchase of Croke Park through Croke Cup games against Louth. Recalls various medals that have been won by players from the club.

16:03 Tim recalls his family's involvement in the GAA. Mentions Jimmy and Kevin Maunsell.

16:37 Mossie recalls his family's involvement in the GAA.

Explains where he got his interest in the GAA from.

17:41 Mossie and Joe recall training methods in their younger days. Joe mentions Mick Moriarty and his first organised training session, refers to the different lifestyle in his younger days.

19:15 Joe discusses the history of GAA clubs in Castlegregory – mentions previous clubs from Cloghane, Castlegregory, Baile Dubh, Stradbally, Magharees and Aughacasla. Mentions the first team ever from Castlegregory playing in 1900. Discusses effects of emigration.

20:36 Joe discusses the founding of Castlegregory GAA club. Mentions Dr Teehan, Spillanes, Bolands and Moores. Recalls successes of the club. Recalls finish to 2010 All-Ireland Junior Club Final.

22:12 Mossie recalls the GAA in his school days. Mentions playing in Croke Park and friendships made.

22:49 Joe recalls the GAA in his school days in the Technical School in Tuam. Mentions St. Jarlath's in Tuam and St. Vincent's in Dublin and players such as Kevin Heffernan, Ollie Freeney and Jim Crowley. Recalls the strength of Tuam Stars in the fifties. Mentions soccer and rugby in modern times competing with GAA.

24:10 Joe and Mossie discuss the history of hurling in Castlegregory. They mention the influence of schoolteacher Gerald Whyte. They also mention camogie. Mention North Kerry as being the stronghold of hurling in the county.

26:10 Mossie discusses the role of the GAA club in the community. Mentions St Patrick's Day parade. Joe describes the facilities that are available at the club – mentions Boy Scouts from Roscrea. Quotes Jackie Healy Rea regarding the beauty of the area.

29:18 Joe recalls some of the characters in the club. Mentions former PRO and Secretary David Fitzgerald. They discuss his weekly column of club notes for The Kerryman. Joe mentions Mick O'Donnell and Paddy Healy. Mentions melodeon playing during matches. Mossie recalls John Kenny in Magherees and Gerry Flynn.

31:47 Joe discusses a handball alley in Cloghane, near Brandon and also in Aughacasla School.

32:30 Mossie recalls songs written about the club. Mentions "The Kickers of Lios na Caol Bhuidhe". They discuss the

origins of the song.

33:25 Joe discusses the club's involvement in Scór.

35:05 Joe discusses the involvement of teachers and clergy in the club. Mentions Fr Denis Curtin from Knocknagoshel and the purchase of pitch from the land commission. Mentions Con McGrath, Guard from Cork, whose son Paul McGrath played with Cork in 1990s. Mentions teacher Marie Burke and teachers generally in Cloghane and Aughacasla.

37:00 Joe recalls where the club played matches before the purchase of the field in 1947. Mentions funds from local carnival.

37:55 Mossie discusses his playing career. Recalls successes achieved. Discusses administrative roles with the club. Recalls his favourite role with the club.

39:50 Joe recalls his career with Castlegregory and West Kerry. Remembers playing with players such as Sean Murphy, Tom Long and Seamus Murphy. Discusses his administrative roles with the club. Recalls club's Junior All-Ireland victory in Croke Park – mentions Sean Kelly. Mentions his favourite role with the club.

42:24 Joe explains the importance of Castlegregory's All-Ireland Junior Championship win to the club. Mossie recalls supporters coming from San Francisco, Boston, New York and England. They discuss the celebrations after the win. Mention meal with Kiltimagh and celebrations at the Citywest hotel. Mention Sean Kelly opening up Croke Park for junior and intermediate club finals.

45:37 They discuss the commitment of inter-county players.

46:44 They discuss their first trips to Croke Park. Joe mentions 1959 All-Ireland Football Final between Kerry and Galway. Mentions Sean Murphy. Recalls being in the Nally Stand. Mossie mentions 1968 All-Ireland Football Final between Kerry and Down. Mentions the journey to Dublin.

48:42 Mossie describes travelling to local matches.

49:27 Mossie discusses the area that Castlegregory GAA club covers. Mentions Conor Pass and Brandon. Joe explains the intricacies of the Gaelic football structure in Castlegregory. Mentions Maharees, Stradbally and Aughacasla.

51:20 Joe discusses club rivalry. Mossie mentions clubs such

	as Annascaul, Lispole, Dingle and An Ghaeltacht.
	52:30 Joe discusses fundraising in the club. Mossie recalls a fundraiser ahead of the 2010 All-Ireland Junior Club Final. Mentions Maurice Spillane running club lotto. Mentions Micheál Lynch of Spar being the main club sponsor.
	55:54 Joe discusses the role of volunteers within the GAA.  Mossie describes the role that they currently play in the club.
	57:39 Mossie recalls how the role of women within the club has changed over time. Mentions secretary of the club, Gert Spillane.
	58:36 Joe discusses the banning of pitch invasions at Croke Park. Joe and Mossie also make brief reference to the opening of Croke Park to other sports, mention Sean Kelly.
	01:00:29 Mossie and Joe describe their best memories of their involvement in the GAA.
