| Interview Summary | John talks about his involvement in the GAA over the years from playing with Naomh Columba, Glencolmcille in Donegal to becoming chairman of Ballyconnell First Ulsters in Cavan. He discusses growing up in Donegal and what the GAA was like there before moving to Cork to build boats. He talks about joining the Gardaí Síochána in the early 1980s and relocating to Ballyconnell in Cavan. John discusses his involvement in the club there and his eventual transfer from Glencolmcille. He describes the role of GAA in Ballyconnell and how it was the first GAA club in Ulster. He talks about his work in the Gardaí and the relationship this had with the club. He talks about the impact of the Troubles on the club and the experience of the GAA in the North and South of Ireland. John discusses his various roles in the club over the years and describes his involvement in the Gaeltacht All-Ireland. - 08:50 Discusses the rivalry between Glencolmcille and Kilcar. Mentions John Joe Doherty, Noel Hegarty and the McHughs and the year Donegal won the All-Ireland.
- 09:34 Talks about the importance of rivalries in the GAA. Describes how it can sometimes get out of hand.
- 10:56 Describes the type of role the club plays in the community. A boxing club in the area also.
- 11:48 Talks about going to Skibbereen to be an apprentice boat builder. Training with the O'Donovan Rossa club.
- 12:28 Discusses joining the Gardaí Síochána in 1980. Moving to Ballyconnell.
- 12:40 Talks about the similarities in the GAA Cork and Donegal. Recalls breaking his ankle.
- 13:50 Talks about his Gardaí training in Templemore. No Sigerson Cup at that stage. Playing on different teams in the college. Mentions Matt Connor of Offaly.
- 14:54 Discusses getting involved with the Kildallan club in Ballyconnell known as Ballyconnell First Ulsters. Describes getting a transfer from his club in Donegal. Mentions Tom Maguire, Michael Oliver.
- 16:54 Describes travelling home to Donegal to play matches before he joined Kildallan.
- 17:59 Talks about the Kildallan club when he first joined. Recalls a semi-final they lost and the aftermath.

- 20:30 Recalls playing illegally in a match but is against people doing it.
- 21:52 Discusses the different Gaelic games played in the club. Ladies football, hurling, rounders as well as football.
- 23:40 Talks about how the hurling club is separate, called Woodford Gaels.
- 24:14 Discusses the history of the Kildallan club. The first GAA club in Ulster. Talks about the 125th anniversary of the club and the celebrations organised. Parade through the town.
- 27:18 Talks about training underage teams and the underage structure in the club. Problems with numbers.
- 29:34 Talks about the involvement of foreign nationals in the club.
- 30:50 Discusses the changes in the club and grounds since he was involved. Mentions Sean Quinn.
- 32:40 Describes the type of fundraising done to improve the ground and to keep the club going. Mostly lotto.
- 33:50 Talks about the impact of the recession on the community and how jobs provided by Sean Quinn helped the area. The expenses of the club.
- 35:50 Describes how local businesses sponsor the club.
- 37:16 Discusses becoming chairman of the club. Mentions the previous chairman John O'Hara.
- 39:19 Talks about characters of the club. Mentions Tony Connelly, Cathal Reilly, Raymond Ovens, Jimmy Murray, Tom Maguire.
- 41:08 Discusses being a member of the Gardaí and how this affects his role in the GAA. Talks about the role of the Gardaí in the GAA in general. Mentions
- 43:49 Talks about the Gardaí competition and how it worked. Divided up around the country.
- 45:49 Discusses the role of the clergy and teachers in the GAA. Mentions former teacher and chairman of Donegal county board Francie Cunningham. Gives his opinion on male and female teachers in modern times. Importance of the GAA in schools.
- 48:00 Talks about players of different religions in the club and

issues surrounding this.

- 49:48 Discusses the Troubles and the how this impacted on the club and his own travels to Donegal at weekends. Being stopped at checkpoints.
- 51:31 Describes difference in experiences of the GAA from those in the North and in the South. Mentions Crossmaglen.
- 52:50 Talks about changes in his old club in Glencolmcille.
- 54:09 Discusses his hopes for the future of Ballyconnell First Ulsters. Talks about the issue of alcohol.
- 57:31 Talks about his own ambitions within the GAA and his desire to manage a team.
- 58:14 Talks about his sons' and daughters' involvement in the GAA.
- 59:54 Describes the type of sacrifices he has made during his time in the GAA.
- 01:02:14 Talks about his involvement in refereeing. Recalls a match that went wrong.
- 01:04:33 Describes his favourite memory of his time involved with the GAA. Talks about the first year he won the Garda All-Ireland. Celebrating in town after the club won four trophies in 1978.
- 01:07:20 Talks about his biggest disappointment in the GAA. Gives his opinion on the rules changing over the years for the worse.
- 01:09:12 Chooses Michael Oliver as his GAA hero. Mentions Mick O'Dwyer, Kevin Heffernan, Micheál Ó Muircheartaigh.
