Interview Summary	Members of Letterkenny Gaels talk about their involvement in the GAA over the years. They discuss their early memories of the Association and how they became involved first in the GAA and then with Letterkenny Gaels. Dan discusses moving to Birmingham and playing with a GAA club there while Garry talks about leaving for America and playing football there. The group talks about the founding of the Letterkenny Gaels and recall the early days of the clubs. They discuss the problems they had with being affiliated to the GAA and how there were objections from other areas. They talk about the initial make- up of the club and how it fared in its early matches. They describe the club's first grounds and the development of the club's facilities since the beginning. They talk about the building of a new club house and what that will mean for the club. The group talks about the role of the club in the community and the rivalry with the other GAA club in Letterkenny, St. Eunan's. Towards the end of the interview the group talks about the highpoints of Letterkenny Gaels so far and give their hopes for the future of the club.

only formed in the 1970s. Playing in a field at home before the club was founded. The club founders included John McMahon, Francie Ward, Sean Marley, Francie Martin Senior and Mickey McDermott.
04:50 (Dan) Talks about his early memories of the GAA, going to a hurling match with his father. Changing in whin / furze bushes. Development of facilities.
07:03 (Sean) Recalls his earliest memories of the GAA. Going to Kilcar matches with his father in Fintra and Ardara. Talks about going to Croke Park to see Kerry play Galway in the 1965 All-Ireland final in a Volkswagan car. Mentions Mick O'Connell and Mick O'Dwyer, Cyril Dunne, Mattie McDonagh and the Colleran brothers. Staying in a house in Drumcondra.
09:39 (Garry) Discusses his early memories of the GAA. Going to MacCumhaill Park. Going to see MacCumhaill's (McCools) play Gaoth Dobhair (Gweedore) in a county final. Going to Croke Park in 1975. Playing his first match with Robert Emmet's Under 12 and getting lost on his way to the pitch in Tiernisk. Club was an amalgamation between Castlefinn and Killygordon – describes some of the issues with this. Red Hughs being formed. Recalls the Sunday Independent bringing out a colour paper on All-Ireland final day.
13:40 (James) Talks about his involvement with the GAA. Joining the Gardaí in 1983 and travelling around the country and getting involved with the GAA in places like Glenties. Recalls a series of matches between Glenties and Ardara. Getting involved with Letterkenny Gaels.
17:35 (Jim) Discusses how he became involved in the GAA. Becoming assistant secretary of the Glenfinn club. Getting involved with the Letterkenny Gaels through his sons. Becoming club secretary.
21:28 (James) Talks about going to the Banada Abbey school in Sligo and the role of the GAA in the school. Winning a Connacht Colleges' final. Mentions St. Nathy's and St. Jarlath's and a teacher Michael Collins.
22:54 (Dan) Talks about his involvement in the GAA. First in Tournafulla in Limerick before moving to Donegal. Emigrating to Birmingham and playing there. Getting involved with Letterkenny Gaels.
28:00 (Sean) Discusses how he became involved with the GAA. Getting involved with the Kilcar club. Mentions the

	McHugh brothers. An amalgamation between Kilcar and Glencolmcille. Not getting to trials because they were working on the farm. Going to the opening of the folk village in Glencolmcille and seeing Charlie Mitchell. Going to board in St. Eunan's College in Letterkenny. Getting Blackthorn Boots. Mentions the Loughanure Cup and Herald Cup. Playing football in Sligo Regional College and making the county minor team.
	32:42 Recalls playing senior football for Kilcar and getting his first car. Playing with and managing the reserve team. Helping with managing Letterkenny Gaels in the 1990s.
	38:00 (Jim) Talks about his best memories of his time in the GAA, being in Croke Park in 1992 when Donegal won the All- Ireland football final. Discusses his worst memories about the GAA. Talks about the role of the GAA in his life.

59:49 (All) They describe the club's first ground and issues with getting goalposts. Going with Liam Emery to Rockhill. Developing their current ground at the Glebe.
