Interview Summary	This is a short interview, which begins with Pat O'Shea explaining the influence of his father's background in the GAA in Kerry and how this shaped his interest in football and, despite being based in Tipperary, his passion for Kerry football. His earliest memory is of chasing for autographs of players and the writer John B. Keane in the aftermath of the 1969 All-Ireland semi-final between Kerry and Dublin. O'Shea talks about the influence of his father and mother's family on his sporting outlook and also that of his son. In addition, he discusses the place that the GAA has plays in community life; the waning involvement of the clergy in GAA affairs; changes in media coverage and the challenges that face the GAA into the future. 00:00:09 Earliest GAA memory: Chasing autographs of players and John B Keane after the Kerry's Dublin All-Ireland semi-final in 1969. 00:00:40 Training for football teams when underage. 00:01:10 Family background: refers to father playing for various teams including Castlegregory, Fethard, Clusty (Tipperary) and Fermanagh at inter-county level when based Lisnakea during the 'war years'. 00:01:44 Mother's family involvement in the GAA with Arravale Rovers in football and hurling. 00:02:06 Family discussions of GAA memories, slagging around previous encounters and 'bragging rights.' 00:03:00 Describes Tipperary as his county, his initial preference football, travelling to matches with his father and supporting his county - Kerry. Says his interest in hurling only began with his son's involvement and their family move to Thurles.
