Interview Summary	The group talk about their earliest memories of their local clubs; Kilmore in Tommie and Teresa's case and Elphin in Sheila's. They talk of their family's involvement and remember what facilities were like. Tommie gives an account of the history of GAA in the area, including the initial foundation of the club, its subsequent demise and eventually reformation. They talk about their involvement in playing and administration over the years and Tommie describes the nature of his involvement in certain controversies, including the changes to Rule 42 which led to the opening of Croke Park to soccer and rugby. The group highlight the social aspect of the GAA, its amateur status, the role of the club in their community and the loyalties they all hold to their club and to their county.

16:20 Tommie gives a brief history of the GAA in the county and the formation of the Kilmore GAA. Mentions Corralara, Aughrim Mandevilles. Tells of the first official match in the parish on 2 nd Feb 1889.

36:45 Sheila discusses her memories of travelling by car to matches. Talks about her family's interest in Gaelic games. Mentions the Under 21 All-Ireland 1966. Mentions John Fahy and Danny O'Rourke.
38:38 Sheila and Tommie talk of Sheila's father's involvement with the Roscommon County Board.
39:18 Teresa talks about going to matches in Tommie's Morris Minor. Describes her relationship with Tommie's sister.
40:35 Sheila explains why she became involved in First Aid. Refers to a match her son played in Ballinlough. Gives an account of how she came to Kilmore.
41:40 Tommy tells of initial tension with Shannon Gaels GAA when Kilmore was reformed. Mentions the Carneys and the

Hanleys. Mentions Éire Óg GAA and Michael Glaveys GAA.
43:08 Tommie talks about the achievements of people from the parish with Roscommon and with other counties from the early 1900s. Mentions Paul Cox, Martin Barry, Hill Street, M Kelly, Jimmy McGauran, Joey Bambrick, Kevin Bambrick, Gerry Connellan, Marty Cummins, Peter Connellan and the Garvey brothers. Mentions Tipperary, Dublin, Galway.
