Interview Summary	Anthony and Betty Doyle talk about their involvement in the GAA over the years. They discuss growing up in Rathnew and the area was like during the 1940s and 1950s. They talk about their family's interest in the GAA and how they became involved with the Association. They discuss the history of the club and how it has developed over the years. They talk about the club's success in the 1940s and in recent years, including the winning of the Leinster club championship in 2001. Anthony talks about his playing career with Rathnew and with the Wicklow minor team. They discuss their involvement in the administration of the club and recall taking part in the Scór competition. Anthony talks about his refereeing career and the sometimes tenuous relationship Rathnew has had with the county board. They give their opinion on the various rule changes and issues within the GAA over the years including the removing of the ban on foreign games and the growth of professionalism. Towards the end of the interview they highlight the important role the GAA has played in their lives and describe what the Association means to them.

03:45 Recalls travelling from Rathnew to Wicklow in a parade with her father. Talks about meeting Anthony. Recalls Anthony breaking his leg in a match. Discusses her family's involvement in the GAA and how her brother played for Wicklow. Talks about her sons' involvement and how Anthony was suspended for playing soccer.

10:45 Talks about getting involved in the club at a committee level. Discusses Anthony's father's involvement in the GAA. Gives her opinion on current GAA fixtures for the championship and the league.

13:28 (Anthony) Discusses the foundation of the club in 1886 and the early success of the club. Talks about the rivalry with Baltinglass and the club's relationship with Kilmacud Kickhams.

15:10 Talks about Rathnew's three-in-a-row championship victories in 1941, 1942 and 1943. Mentions James Doyle

16:50 Discusses playing senior football for Rathnew for 17 years. Winning a championship in 1970. Winning the junior hurling championship in 1979. Going to school in St Joseph's. Mentions Father Lavelle and his role in drama in the village.

19:38 Talks about the success of Rathnew from 1979 to the winning of the Leinster club championship in 2001.

20:38 Describes what the final was like in 2001 and the celebrations after.

22:03 (Both) They talk about the different sports in the village like tug of war and pitch and toss. Describes what was involved in the game of pitch and toss. Recall men coming to mass with their boots to play football after.

25:45 (Betty) Talks about handball in the area. Recalls what they did as children in the area.

27:52 Discusses the type of employment opportunities in the area during the 1950s and 1960s. Talks about the impact of emigration on the club during this period.

29:00 (Both) They talk about the annual Corpus Christi procession in Rathnew.

31:11 They discuss the role of the GAA in Rathnew. Discusses the brickyard in the village.

- 33:10 They talk about hurling in the club in the past.
- 34:16 (Anthony) Discusses the role of the RUC in the village in the 1880s and how the club got its colours.
- 36:21 Talks about his grandfather James Doyle and his role in the founding of the club and his father's involvement in the club. Mentions Ned 'Tosser' Doyle. Discusses the death of his father.
- 39:15 Recalls how the club picked the team in St Brigid's hall and sneaking in to see the team.
- 39:55 Discusses his own playing career with Rathnew. Talks about the Forestry College team. Recalls illegal players on the team.
- 41:57 Talks about playing soccer during the 1960s and being banned from Gaelic games for two years.
- 43:15 (Betty) Notes how Rathnew were unsuccessful during those years because many of their players were suspended.
- 43:54 (Anthony) Talks about playing with the Wicklow minor team.
- 45:45 (Betty) Recalls meeting Anthony and her interest in Gaelic games. Watching camogie matches. Losing the nine-in-a-row final against St Patrick's in 2004.
- 48:35 Describes the different type of fundraising events for the club. Running a lord mayor campaign.
- 52:15 Discusses the development of the club's grounds over the years.
- 54:22 Talks about how Rathnew has changed over the years and the impact of this on the club.
- 56:35 Discusses the impact of the club's success on juvenile involvement.
- 57:43 Talks about her brother Mosey Coffey's involvement in the GAA.
- 01:01:50 (Both) They describe the types of places they travelled to following the county team. Recall visiting the Crossmaglen Rangers' ground.
- 01:04:16 They discuss the issue of finance in Wicklow GAA.
- 01:05:08 They talk about their family and the role of the GAA

	in their daily lives.
	01:06:00 They discuss their involvement in the Scór competition and the role of it in the Rathnew club. Give their opinion on the current format of Scór.
	01:11:42 (Anthony) Talks about his refereeing career.
	01:13:28 (Both) They describe the club's relationship with the county board. Recalls issues with a former county chairman and secretary and how it impacted on the club's rivalry with St Patrick's. Mentions Ronan Coffey.
