Interview Summary	Geraldine, Maria and Anne recall their earliest memories of the GAA. They each recall their own careers in the GAA, from playing to coaching, as well as administration. The highs and lows of their involvement in ladies football are recalled, specifically underage All-Ireland successes and defeats with Meath. All three discuss and debate the difficulties that ladies football faces, detailing instances where they have felt they have been treated differently to their male counterparts. They also talk about the nature of the relationship between ladies football and camogie in Meath. They talk about their best memories from their involvement in the GAA, and discuss their heroes in the GAA. All three conclude by examining what motivates them to remain involved in ladies football and the GAA.

11:55 Anne discusses playing equipment and gear in her playing days.

13:23 Anne recalls figures in ladies GAA in Meath. Mentions Ultan Fitzpatrick and Kitty Carroll.

14:22 Anne talks about teams she played against. Mentions Cormeen, Fyanstown, Kells Post Office, Simonstown and Drumbaragh.

14:59 Anne recalls the reaction of men to the establishment of ladies football in the area.

15:33 Anne recalls travelling to matches. Mentions Fyanstown. Also mentions the Jolly Old Horse in Cormeen.

16:17 Maria discusses her playing career. Mentions Dunshaughlin and Royal Gaels. Recalls county final against Moylough when club was thrown out of championship due to "parish rule". Mentions Aileen Byrne and Seoirse Dwyer. Recalls being a founder member of Royal Gaels. Mentions Dearbhla O'Carroll and Christine O'Brien. Recalls Leinster Final against Dublin in Dunboyne. Mentions Fiona Mahon. Mentions All-Ireland semi-final defeat to Kerry.

19:40 Also recalls match against Seneschalstown, recalls being sent-off along with her best friend, forcing her to miss All-Ireland semi-final. Recalls captaining Meath to All-Ireland Under 16 success. Mentions Geraldine Sheridan, Mickey and Ann Collins and Marie Doyle. Also mentions Sean Walsh and his role in the club. Recalls match against Seneschalstown before team broke up.

25:00 Maria discusses her coaching career. Mentions Ollie

Bowe, Eamon Murray, Ollie Callaghan, Mary O'Shaughnessy, Mary Coyle, Maeve Murray, Eimear Murray and Jenny Rispin.

26:33 Maria discusses her role as a development officer with the GAA. Mentions Christine O'Brien, Gillian Bennett and Dudley Farrell.

29:16 Maria recalls her ladies football career in college. Mentions Strawberry Hills and Inchicore. Recalls playing soccer in Inchicore, as well as running and swimming. Also mentions Waterford IT, Athlone IT, John Anderson and Chester University.

33:13 Geraldine discusses her playing career. Mentions John Mitchels in Birmingham. Mentions St Barnabas GAA club in Nottingham. Also mentions Jimmy Walsh and his role in ladies GAA in Birmingham. She recalls the facilities that were available. Mentions her sisters Phil and Bernie, as well as Chrissie King from Roscommon. Recalls the formation of the ladies club. Mentions Ann Lyster. Recalls how she became chairman of the ladies GAA club. Mentions Angela and Teresa Baggot, as well as Helen O'Rourke and Mick Fitzgerald. Mentions her lack of proficiency in the Irish language.

39:30 Geraldine discusses the progression of ladies GAA in the Birmingham area. Mentions playing for Warwickshire. Recalls matches against Parnells of London. Also mentions Round Towers.

40:48 Geraldine discusses returning to live in Ireland.
Mentions Navan O'Mahonys. Discusses her children's
involvement in the GAA. Also mentions Seneschalstown.
Mentions her involvement with the county team also.
Mentions training at St Oliver's school. Recalls song that was
sung on the pitch before every match - "We are the Meath
girls".

43:42 Maria recalls prayer that was recited before every match, and sings the pre-match song "We are the Meath girls". Mentions Ollie Bowe.

44:32 Geraldine recalls the camaraderie of the teams she managed. Mentions All-Ireland final in Carlow against Waterford. Recalls penalty incident involving Geraldine Doherty. Also mentions Mick Fitz. Recalls All-Ireland semifinal defeat to Kerry. Anne recalls bus breaking down on way to Kerry game.

48:06 Geraldine recalls playing her last game in ladies

football, for Seneschalstown, in Leinster semi-final against Timahoe. Mentions the late Lulu Carroll, as well as Sue Ramsbottom. Also mentions Mary, Mena and Patrick Sheridan.

49:59 Geraldine recalls Under 16 game that Meath won. Mentions Mickey and Ann Collins, Mena Sheridan and Katie O'Brien. Recalls Maria Kealy parading around Páirc Tailteann with the cup.

51:44 Maria describes the emotion of victory in the under 16 All-Ireland final. Geraldine recalls the Garda escort that accompanied the team in Navan, mentions John Moroney. They also recall defeats. Geraldine mentions Mickey Collins, Katie O'Brien and other players who made the senior panel – Maria Kealy, Mary and Mena Sheridan, Gráinne and Geraldine. She also mentions Paula Cunningham, Meath manager from Monaghan.

54:52 Anne discusses her career in the GAA. Mentions moving to Australia and recalls meeting the Irish International Rules (then Compromise Rules) team in Perth. Mentions Jack O'Shea in Subiaco Oval. Describes returning to Ireland and becoming involved with Simonstown Gaels. Recalls the progression of her coaching career.

57:30 Anne recalls her administrative roles with club and county. Mentions Geraldine Sheridan and Maria Kealy. Recalls compiling the history of ladies football in Meath.

01:00:07 Anne discusses developments in Meath ladies football over the years.

01:01:51 Geraldine discusses the administrative aspect of ladies football. Discusses relationship with mens' Gaelic football. Mentions Páirc Tailteann and Dunganny. She discusses the difficulty of fundraising.

01:03:56 Anne compares funding for ladies' GAA to that of their male counterparts.

01:04:55 Maria discusses the differences between ladies football and the main GAA body.

01:06:42 Anne recalls incident at ladies football Under 16 match.

01:08:09 Maria discusses the issue of Royal Gaels amalgamating with Dunshaughlin. She discusses the facilities that the ladies club has.

01:23:34 Anne, Geraldine and Maria provide examples of the costs involved in running a ladies team.

01:25:05 Anne talks about fundraising.

01:26:23 They discuss the relationship between ladies football and camogie in Meath. Anne discusses the challenges involved in accommodating all teams on her club's two pitches. Geraldine recalls attempting to reach an arrangement with camogie regarding fixtures.

01:32:57 They discuss the challenges faced by dual players. They mention players such as Claire Coffey, Aoife Thompson and Fiona O'Neill. They also mention Jenny Rispin and Clare Coffey.
