He also goes on to discuss the present role of the GAA in both Armagh and Irish society.

Speaks about the role of schools in the GAA and the differences between club/county playing as against national competitions. 00:10:50 Discusses debts incurred in running the grounds and clubs and speaks about the fundraising done for Armagh GAA. Mentions Gerry Fagan, Pat McMahon, Stanley Headly,
00:12:47 Describes the change in financial backing, income and financial support in Armagh GAA from the 1980's to the present. Discusses the need for the establishment of the National Finance Management Committee with Gerry Fagan and Jack Lutheran to deal with the new challenges and organising finances on a club and county level. Mentions Dan Moore, Michael Maher and Fr. Dan (Cavan).
00:15:00 Discussed the way in the finances were organised, and how the National Finance Management Committee, promoted financial organisation and standardisation within the GAA on a county level. Mentions personal sacrifices made to implement this structure, the difficulties of getting counties to adopt computerised accounting systems, and the increased importance of coporate governance. Also discusses being involved in the financial management of Croke Park for a few years as part of the GAA's national budget plan.
00:18:55 Peadar speaks about the evolution of the financial management of the GAA on a national level and the interaction with Croke Park. Mentions Kathy Slattery, Frank Geary, Tom Ryan.
00:20:33 Discusses corporate sponsorship and the way in which this has impacted on the GAA. Mentions different sponsors for Armagh, Morgan Fuels, Carna Transport, Barry Hughes, Newry Building Supplies and the benefit sponsorship has had on business in Armagh through the GAA.
00:22:53 Talks about setting up a committee to win an All Ireland title for Armagh, via improved standards and training. Discusses the professionalisation of the running of Armagh GAA. Mentions Seamus King, Jim McCorry, John Morrison, Gene Duffy, Paddy Nugent, Brian McAlinden, Brian Canavan, Jarleth Burnes, Benny Tierney, Paul McGrean, Cian McGeeny, Diarmuid Marsden. John McInty, Tony McInty
00:26:00 Discusses opening a shop to sell Armagh Jerseys in order to raise money for Armagh GAA and how it became a proper business and raised the profile for the association. Mentions O'Neill's, Paddy Nugent.

00:27:05 Speaks about the changes required for Armagh team including change of management in 2001. Peadar also discusses his hopes for another All-Ireland title for Armagh. Mentions Cross McGlenn GAC, Joe Jordan.
00:31:25 Tells story of receiving the All Ireland Cup in 2003 and bringing it to the graveyard where his family were buried. Discusses goals and achieving goals within Armagh GAA and winning first Ulster Championship. Also speaks about the All- Ireland final. Mentions Peter McDonnell, and personal sacrifices.
