Interview Summary	Patsy Duff, Pat Dillon, Gerry Dillon, Paddy Sheehy and Paddy Meegan talk about their earliest GAA memories, playing football in Syddan. They discuss the lack of facilities and the forms of transport used to travel to matches. They recall travelling to Croke Park for All-Ireland finals and the excitement in Syddan in 1949 and 1954 after the Meath All- Ireland victories. The men talk about their involvement in administration within Syddan club and at county board level. Paddy Meegan talks about his inter-county football career. They discuss what GAA has meant to them in their lifetime and their hopes for Syddan club into the future.

	00:50 Pat talks about his earliest GAA memory – playing juvenile football in Kells. Recalls travelling to matches by bus.
	02:02 Patsy recalls his earliest GAA memories – winning the Under 14 championship. Recalls travelling to matches by pony and trap. Recalls football being called off during the war years (World War Two) from 1941 to 1946.
	03:45 Patsy recalls a school teacher in Newtown taking some of the team to matches in his car.
	04:30 Discusses Syddan winning the championship in 1941. Mentions Tom Keegan.
	05:29 Paddy talks about his earliest GAA memory – playing juvenile football in 1950. Recalls 2 lorries from the community travelling to Croke Park in 1949 for the All-Ireland.
	06:28 The men discuss the rivalry between Louth and Meath in the late 40s and early 50s.
	08:37 Gerry talks about his earliest GAA memories – the

successful Syddan team of the late 70s and early 80s. Recalls attending the All-Ireland final in 1987.
11:30 Patsy lists men within Syddan that have won awards at county level.
16:15 The men discuss the history of the club. Talk about the formation of the club in 1891 – Syddan Emmets.
17:23 The men discuss characters involved in the formation of the club – mention Bill Dillon, Mick Farrelly, Andy Dardis and Tommy Geraghty.
19:20 The men talk about early football in Syddan. Recall an amalgamation with Lobinstown for a short time.
20:50 Facilities in the early days – very poor. Recall using local farmer's fields to play matches.
22:55 Pat recalls lining the fields and putting up goal posts before matches.
23:59 Paddy S talks about attending the All-Ireland final in 1960. Mentions a crowd of 91,000 in attendance.
24:35 Patsy talks about rows at matches in the early days among spectators.
25:20 Pat recalls being at the 1960 All-Ireland.
27:21 Paddy S talks about Down introducing a different style of football in 1960 – fast moving ball.
29:15 The men discuss the development of the club. They talk about the purchase of grounds in the late 1960s. Recall the opening of the pitch in 1971.
30:15 Gerry mentions that Syddan have complete ownership of their facilities and pitch – Meath County Board have no say over the pitch.
31:20 Paddy Meegan joins meeting. Recalls his earliest GAA memory – attending Newtown school in late 1920s. Mentions Fr Drake and his involvement in juvenile football.
32:20 Paddy M recalls Syddan club becoming defunct in the late 1920s. Mentions Bill Dillon – notes that he played with Castletown in these years. Recalls that Bill won a Feis Cup.
35:15 Talks about the revival of the Syddan club in the mid 1930s. Recalls the progression into intermediate football in 1939.

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	36:15 Discusses the death of Tom Keegan during an intermediate match in 1939.
	37:44 Paddy M recalls that Syddan were confined to Newtown Parish. Teams at the other end of the parish made up The Bog Larks club. Fierce rivalry.
	39:27 Recalls an amalgamation with Lobinstown in 1947. Recalls winning a senior championship in 1949.
	44:20 Paddy M discusses the Feis Cup – a longstanding tournament for senior and intermediate teams in Meath.
	45:35 Paddy M recalls being present at the purchase of the Keegan Cup, a second hand cup from a London horseshow.
	49:23 Recalls the Keegan Cup being presented to Fr Tully on the Meath County Board in 1953. Navan O'Mahony's were first team to win the cup. Syddan won in 1956.
	50:30 Paddy M talks about the purchase of grounds for Syddan club. Mentions Tom Ludlow – bought land and donated field to the club and land to the church.
	52:55 Paddy M – Rivalry with Skryne. Talks about the formation of the North Meath Team, an amalgamation of 7 teams. Recalls the proposal being brought to the Meath County Board.
	55:37 The North Meath team comprised of Drumconrath, Nobber, Castletown, Kilmainhamwood, Rathkenny, Meath Hill, The Bog Larks. Only lasted about 3 years.
	58:09 Paddy S talks about the cessation of the North Meath team.
	59:20 Paddy S and Pat recall their playing days with Syddan.
	01:00:04 Patsy talks about Syddan men who played on the Meath county team.
	01:03:32 Paddy M talks about his playing days – 2 All-Ireland wins in 1949 and 1954 and his Railway Cup successes.
	01:05:42 Paddy M talks about his call up to the county team. Recalls being selected after an intermediate championship match with Syddan. Played from 1942 – 1954 and never missed a championship match.
	01:07:21 Discusses training on the county team.
	01:08:30 Recalls staying in Gibbstown for a fortnight before

the All-Ireland final in 1949 – collective training.
01:11:00 Discusses the All-Ireland final in 1949 – recalls suffering from a sprained ankle.
01:11:50 Talks about the celebrations that ensued after the All-Ireland victory.
01:13:34 Paddy S recalls celebrations in Meath.
01:14:14 Paddy M tells a story of Mickey Murphy.
01:19:15 Patsy discusses his playing career. He recalls playing football at minor level but injuring his knee. Mentions that there was no support from the GAA in those days.
01:20:40 Discusses his tenure on the county board for 20 years.
01:21:09 Patsy talks about the difference in the structure of football today compared to his early playing days.
01:22:15 Patsy recalls travelling to minor county board meetings in Navan by bicycle.
01:24:15 Gerry talks about his role in administration. Talks about the importance of young people becoming involved in the administration side of the club.
01:28:10 Gerry discusses the expenses of running a club today.
01:29:30 The men discuss fundraising efforts within the club.
01:30:08 The men discuss past fundraising efforts – recall that not as much money was needed in earlier years.
01:32:32 Paddy M notes that he represented Syddan at county board level on several occasions. Recalls objecting to venues and referees.
01:33:30 Pat and Paddy S discuss their involvement with the club.
01:34:20 The men discuss the lack of hurling in the community. They recall a teacher in Newtown bringing hurling into the school for a short time.
01:37:10 The men talk about football being played in Syddan before the formation of the GAA.
01:38:20 The men discuss the impact of World War Two on the GAA.
