WHY?

Due to the lack of opportunities available for children with disabilities to take part in GAA.

AIMS



- To design and coordinate a GAA inclusive club development model.
- To increase opportunities for people with disabilities to take part in GAA clubs in Cork.
- To increase capacity in clubs to provide GAA for people of all abilities.
- To empower clubs to sustain the programme.

IMPLEMENTATION

- Create a Cork GAA For All network of key stakeholders.
- Establish GAA For All committees in participating clubs.
- Provide training & education opportunities to clubs involved.
- Design a promotional campaign for recruitment of players.
- Provide access to suitable resources & equipment for sessions.
- Coordinate the implementation of club GAA For All sessions & support the Cul Camp delivery.
- Evaluate and review the effectiveness of the programme.



IMPACTS

- An inclusive GAA Club Model has been designed.
- Increased knowledge & understanding of disability & inclusion in GAA clubs in Cork
- Increased levels of physical activity for children with a disability.
- Increased awareness of how GAA club coaches can support players with a disability.
- Stronger relationships between schools, clubs & communities.

OUTPUTS
