A Special Meeting Central Council was held at Croke Park on Sunday 13<sup>th</sup> May 1921 Mr James Howlett Presiding the following members of the Council were in attendance (Messrs P. McDonnell (President) P. O'Brien J. Keane & L. J. Croke Secy.

The meeting was called to decide what action should be taken with reference to Hospital Sunday. After the question had been carefully considered it was decided that owing to present conditions existing no inter County matches be arranged but the various Leagues in Dublin together with the Leagues Committee be requested to arrange a series of matches the proceeds to be retained for the Hospital Sunday fund.

An application was received from Mr Henderson Ballykinlar Camp requesting that in no 1 inter Camp

Athletic competitions were being held and was inviting the Council to present medals "15 events Coupled with a big Jaws competition. The Council unanimously decided to provide 15 gold medals for the various athletic events & Silver medal with Gold centres for the big Jaws competition the Secy was directed to write Mr Henderson explaining the conditions under which the medals were being presented namely to the winners of the inter Camp competition at Special meeting of the Standing Committee

A Special Meeting of the General & Inter County Presidents except Brett McDonnell Keane popular Harry Steadman Committee was held at Croke Park on 30 July 1921.  
a further letter was received from Mr Henderson stating the inter Camp

Competition would not likely be held and suggesting that the promised medals be given to No 1 Camp, the Committee ~~unanimously~~ unanimously decided to adhere to their previous order that the medals be presented only for the inter Camp Competition.

A letter was also received from Mr. Smyth Ballykinlar Camp making application for the supply of an Gymnasium outfit.

Requement the Secy was directed to inform Mr. Smyth that the Council much regretted their present financial position prevented them from complying with the request.

The Secy explained to the meeting the possibility of Mr. Farquaherons House & Ground <sup>being offered</sup> for sale, after fully considering the matter it was decided to approach the Duke with the view of purchasing or if Mr. Keane would consider taking

over the property in trust for the same the matter was left in the hands of the chairman to make the necessary arrangements.
